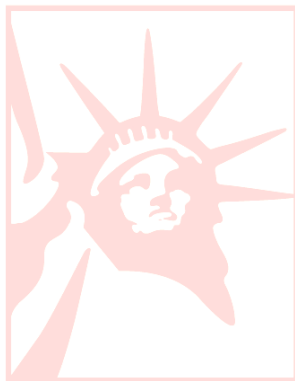

Frances X. Hogan, Esq. is a practicing attorney in the Boston area. She has served on the Board of the Massachusetts Catholic Conference since 1986 and chairs its Pro-Life/Pro-Family Subcommittee. She has been a member of the National Advisory Council to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. Attorney Hogan has also served on numerous boards and committees in the Archdiocese of Boston, the Board of the Pro-Life Legal Defense Fund, board member and past president of Massachusetts Citizens for Life, and President of Women Affirming Life. For many years she also served as a Consultant to the Pro-Life Committee of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. In 1996, Attorney Hogan was named by the Vatican to the Pontifical Academy for Life which was created by Blessed John Paul II in his encyclical letter The Gospel of Life and which serves as an important advisory body to the Holy Father on developing bioethical issues ranging from stem cell research to end of life concerns.
